7. **Budget update**

The bank reconciliation for March 2026 had been circulated, together with a summary of the 2025/26 accounts.

8. **Matters relating to the village hall, village green and nature reserve**

Upgrading the kitchen

The kitchen fitter had provided a quote of £5200 for the units and would match the Howdens price for the flooring. Fitting would be an additional £3700. This would be the most expensive option, and it was agreed to go ahead with the Howdens units and DCBS fitting. SW agreed to write the National Lottery Awards for All application.

Windfarm Community Fund projects - update

DW reported that JT had printed off the photographs and one of the photo frame collages had been assembled. As there were insufficient photos to complete all three, she had ordered craft paper to fill the gaps. SW suggested asking Dorothy Appleby if she had any old photos of the village which had not already been scanned.

Makepeace Landscapes were planning to work on the paving outside the hall on 5 May. The exact location of the paving was discussed and agreed.

New Windfarm Community Fund application – furniture for the village hall

The Tow Law windfarm community fund was not yet open for applications.

Seat restoration

The restoration work on the seats would cost around £500 + VAT each and Makepeace Landscapes had quoted £900 + VAT for the bases. This project could also be included in the new windfarm community fund application. The sites for the seats would need to be confirmed and permission obtained from DCC.

S106 play area project

Makepeace Landscapes had treated the play area surface, and the pressure washing was to take place on 29 April. SW agreed to contact Paul Raine regarding a date to repaint the multi play unit.

New S106 play area project – replacement equipment

A representative from Playdale Playgrounds had visited the play area and provided a plan and quote for new equipment. The plan included replacing the springer but removing the seesaw and installing a small slide in its place. In addition, the picnic table would be moved to allow the installation of a new piece of equipment, a small climbing wall. The projected work would cost £15,626.98. It was agreed to submit a new application for Section 106 funding for this project.

9. **Future Projects**

SS suggested planting bulbs around the village hall to brighten the area in the spring and summer months. As planting would need to take place in September, it was agreed to discuss this at the July meeting.

- Tammy Morris-Hale, Senior Ecologist, had replied to the initial request for information about the future of the meadow. DCC's estates team were in the final stages of putting out a grazing tender for the site. This will be conservation grazing with sheep over the autumn and winter months. The tender document would also make clear that the meadow is accessible to walkers and dog walkers.
